Under the leitmotiv "Learning and living Europe", the one-year Joint Master taught in English welcomed an exclusive group of students striving to expand their professional opportunities in an interdisciplinary and academically rich cultural Grand Tour in Rome, Berlin, Nice and Paris.

It aims at professional integration in the field of heritage development in all its forms: political, archaeological, historical and artistic. The emphasis of the programme is on cultural policy, artificial intelligence and the challenges of the ecological and digital twin transition.

The Joint Master in European Cultural Governance (EUCULTURE) offered by CIFE in Berlin and Nice and the School of Government at Luiss Guido Carli in Rome provided the necessary analytical and policy skills through evidence-based studies and practical project work in the three major topics of the programme: European Cultural Heritage, Global Sustainable Development and the Digital Transition in Cultural Governance.

C Western European Culture and the Digital Transition (64 hours)

Europe plays a leading role in digital cultural heritage and has the potential to forge ahead with new technologies such as artificial intelligence and machine learning based on humanistic and ethical principles. Cultural services and networks, artificial intelligence and digital are the new frontier of culture and represent the most dynamically growing part of creation. Digital provisions of cultural services are fundamentally different from the historical focus on preservation in the context of Western European and French cultural heritage. New forms of cooperation agreements and experimentations increasing cultural exchange and network may enable countries in their policy space to promote cultural creations, to safeguard universal heritage and to pursue inclusive development goals.
